Dear Mayor and Council:

We are writing to express our opposition to the proposals by West Coast Olefins Ltd. to build a petrochemical/plastic plant in the BCR site and a natural gas extraction plant in Pineview. We echo concerns about the negative impacts these will have on Prince George's already damaged air- and watersheds, and their short- and long-term health consequences¹.

Private individuals, local industry, and previous municipal governments have all worked hard to improve our city's air quality and alter its reputation as a "grubby industrial town" and "the most dangerous city in Canada". There have been improvements in our air quality in the last decade and it seems ludicrous that these positive steps are now being threatened. The proposals from West Coast Olefins Ltd. may bring some economic benefit but will have long-lasting negative effects on the health and wellness of our land, water, air, not to mention our family, and yours, for decades to come.

Finally, the Lheidli T'enneh First Nation has made it very clear that West Coast Olefins Ltd. is not welcome on their territory.⁵ In support of ongoing Truth and Reconciliation efforts, the City of Prince George should respect this unequivocal statement and decline these proposals.
