Helpful Presentation Suggestions

- Direct your presentation to Members of Council and communicate through the Chair/Mayor
- Be prepared to answer questions from Council.
- Be courteous, respectful and polite.
- Bring at least 12 copies of any materials you wish to provide to Council that were not previously published in the agenda or provided to the Corporate Officer.

Presentation Topic*

I am the Director of Law and Policy, Healthy Indoor Environments, at the BC Lung Association. We currently have programs focused on radon gas, an odorlous, colourless, but radioactive gas that moves from bedrock into soil and can accumulate in homes and other buildings. Radon has been identified as the leading environmental carcinogen in Canada and the leading cause of lung cancer in non-smokers, killing over 3,000 people a year. While radon levels vary from building to building, Health Canada research has found 7 percent of homes in Canada are over Canada's Radon Guideline of 200 Bq/m3 and in some regions the percentage can be much higher. Unfortunately, most homes and other buildings in Canada have not been tested for radon, and many communities do not know local radon levels.

This Fall, the British Columbia Radon Data Repository, housed at the British Columbia Centre for Disease Control has released to us a compilation of all known radon tests in BC. Numbers for Prince George establish a significant radon problem. Due to past testing efforts by BC Lung Association and others, Prince George has more radon tests than any other city in British Columbia, with over 1900 results and these show 34% of homes in the city are above Canada's Radon Guideline of 200 Bg/m3.

I am hoping to appear before Mayor and Council in the second half of October or early November to present these findings. I would like to ask the municipal government to join many other communities across Canada in declaring November Radon Action Month. I hope to be accompanied in my presentation by medical experts from Simon Fraser University's Faculty of Health Sciences to speak to the significance of radon as a health concern. I would also like to speak to possible further actions your government can consider in addressing this significant health risk. In particular, I have worked with Health Canada to develop Radon Action Guides for municipalities, and the BC Lung Association has funding to work with local governments to develop radon strategies and plans.
