

CANADIAN ARTISTIC SWIMMING OLYMPIC TEAM TRAINING CAMP PROPOSAL

- Canada's Artistic Swimming Olympic Team are accepting proposals from all Canadian clubs to host training in preparation for the 2020 Olympics
- Two potential dates: October 22-26 or November 25-30
 - Addition of travel days
- The host club would be required to provide:
 - Pool space
 - Gymnasium
 - Weight room
 - Ground transportation
 - Billet / Accommodation
 - Meals



BUDGET – EXPENSES

- Transportation:
 - Diversify is currently creating a quote
- Food:
 - Provided by club parents
- Pool Rental:
 - 8 lanes x 25m (total of 5 training days)
 - Northwood Room
 - \$1873.61
- Northern Sports Centre:
 - The Executive Director stated they would be willing to have the team use the NSC if there is space available
 - Currently waiting back to hear from Engage Sport North Strength and Conditioning Specialist to determine if they can accommodate
- Accommodation:
 - Currently in contact with Pomeroy
 - Cost is TBA
