Re: Liquor License Application No. LL100162 - Treasure Cove Casino Expansion

This email is in response to the proposed liquor license and expansion application for the Treasure Cove Casino. As a resident of Aitken Crescent, which backs onto the casino hotel property, we have some concerns with the proposed application.

1. Increased Noise Level- We have serious reservations with the proposed increase in occupancy of the casino's Show Lounge, and the proposed increase in liquor serving hours. With homes backing onto the casino property, the increase in activity could be very disruptive and severely impact the quality of life that these residents currently enjoy. The proposed increased liquor service could also create a noise nuisance in the early morning hours.
2. Public Safety: Extending hours for liquor service and increasing the number of customers that could be served increases the potential for criminal activity, which could include driving while impaired, loitering, and assaults. Extended serving hours of alcohol to a larger number of people could also lead to undue pressure on our RCMP officers, dispatch, and hospital.
3. Social Problems: Other than an increase in profits to the casino owners, we don't see any benefit to the public, the neighbours surrounding the casino, or patrons of the casino by extending liquor serving hours from 2 am to 4 am or by increasing the seating capacity of the Show Lounge. With Prince George having a growing concern with alcohol and drug abuse we feel it negligent to in any way contribute to this community problem.

In light of the concerns mentioned above, we do not support the proposed liquor license application No. LL100162 as it is currently outlined.
