### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

# **PURPOSE:**

This report provides summary notes and highlights from the recent 2022 Women's World Curling Championship held at the CN Centre this past March 19 – 27, 2022.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The 2020 World Women's Curling Championship was scheduled for March 2020, but the pandemic forced the event's cancellation one day before the event's opening banquet was scheduled. It was a devastating blow for organizers, Curling Canada staff, City staff, volunteers, and the competitors. Despite the tremendous emotional, financial and other hardships caused by this cancellation, and two years of uncertainty due to the COVID pandemic, the City of Prince George successfully hosted the 2022 Women's World Curling Championship, with reviews from the organizers, participants, fans and partners all indicating an extremely successful event despite the continuing challenges.



Over the nine-day tournament, 34,773 people attended.

The City of Prince George was promoted in a positive manner, and recognized widely and frequently, with highlights including:

- Professionally produced opening videos prior to each of the 24 draws, featuring videos created with the Lheidli T'enneh first nation, and several City of Prince George representatives
- On Ice Logos, visible to 100% of spectators and virtually all camera angles;
- Digital ads (Website, Social Media, TV, Score clock, Welcome signage at YXS, etc.)

- Souvenir Program developed by the City of Prince George Communications manager and Tourism PG:
- Prince George Accommodation list and bus/walking route maps for visitors;
- Prince George Experience Guides for participants and visitors





The tournament featured 15 original TV broadcasts on TSN, with a total of 46 hours of live broadcast coverage, and an additional 55 hours of repeat broadcasts on TSN and TSN2. The overall reach was 4,708,000 Canadians on TSN and RDS. On average, 349,400 Canadians watched the tournament at any given minute of original broadcast coverage. These figures do not include the international viewing through the World curling TV broadcasts. Millions in Japan, China, across Europe, and the United States saw the WCTV feed. The tournament delivered mass reach and generated many millions of media impressions across traditional linear television, digital, and social media touchpoints. While specific numbers are not yet in for the 2022 WWCC, as a comparison, the WWCC 2018 event realized overall impressions at 86.73 million people.

Tourism Prince George reported 1,751 visitors visited their booth during the draws, including fans from Sweden, Germany, USA, Brazil, Eastern Canada, Western Canada, and across British Columbia. Approximately 35% - 40% of all ticket-holders were from outside of Prince George, with several hotels reporting blocks of rooms dedicated to out of town guests and participants. According to Stat Canada, the average Canadian Traveler spends \$330 per overnight stay, while same-day visitors average \$178 per day. The number of visitors was particularly encouraging since only a few weeks prior to the event, there was no certainty the event would occur, let alone if fans would be able to attend. With a very limited amount of time to sell tickets and for people to make travel plans to Prince George, the event organizers were very pleased with the number of visitors.

The Lheidli T'enneh First Nation were included prominently and helped to facilitate a sense of inclusion, respect and partnerships. Chief Dolleen Logan was featured in each opening video welcoming visitors to their territory. For the final championship draw, First Nation carvings were showcased in the arena, and featured in the broadcast as the game was played.

The event created several lasting legacies, including:

- Approximately \$47,000 50/50 funds donated to support the Prince George Curling Club and an additional \$8,408 donated to Curl BC,
- Many local volunteers trained to properly judge and time a world championship curling event,
- Local volunteers trained on how to make and sustain world-class curling ice.

- Building the staff, volunteer and hospitality capacity to host larger national or international sporting events,
- A positive financial outcome for Curling Canada, which was especially gratifying after the negative financial implications from the 2020 event cancellation,
- A surprisingly extra emotional positive response from the organizers and all partners and
  participants, realizing that as a result of the beginning of the COVID pandemic this was one
  of the first major sporting events to be cancelled in 2020. Furthermore, the 2022 event was
  one of the first major sporting events held with spectators. This will result in poignant longterm positive memories from this extra meaningful event.
- Team Canada won the bronze medal!

#### STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

Hosting the 2022 WWCC supports Council Priorities including building and maintaining the relationships necessary to advance coordinated advocacy and action on shared goals; maximize the quality of life for all residents, and broadly market the affordability and quality of life in Prince George.

# FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Council approved a \$300,000 grant from the Major Events Reserve Fund for the 2020 event. Due to the extreme last-minute nature of the cancellation/postponement and the fact that most of the major expenses had been incurred, we were unable to recoup this. However, Curling Canada indicated they would do everything they could to reschedule this event in Prince George. A new agreement was successfully negotiated for the 2022 event, which saw the City of Prince George agreeing to no cash contributions, but up to \$200,000 of in-kind venue costs (CN Centre and Kin 1) supported from the Major Events Reserve Fund. Additionally, as per the agreement the City was successful in applying for a \$250,000 grant from the BC Fairs, Festivals & Events Recovery Fund, which flowed through to Curling Canada, and supported the event's indigenous involvement, marketing/communications, and volunteer expenses.

The following budget numbers are from Curling Canada, who advise us that these are audited internal numbers. More definitive background information will be available later this summer when these numbers are finalized. At that time, Curling Canada will receive their audit report, and the financial details will be publicly reviewable on their website.
