

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# PROJECT OVERVIEW

## OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN (OCP) REVIEW

- The existing OCP was adopted in 2011 and much has changed since that time
- A process that involves research, technical analysis and engagement
- Involves developing a vision for your community with input from various groups of people
- Vision will guide specific land use plans and policies that are developed
- Multiple drafts of the new OCP will be created with community input along the way
- Council will consider a Bylaw through a formal public hearing process





#### WHAT IS AN OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN?

- An OCP describes the long-term vision of a community
- Includes goals, objectives, and policies that guide planning and land use management
- Presents the long-term development plans for a community
- Addresses matters like transportation, housing, sustainability and climate change
- Outlines how a local government plans to exercise its powers
- Municipalities have the authority to develop OCPs under the Local Government Act
- OCPs also acknowledge the traditional territories of Indigenous Peoples
- An opportunity to advance truth and reconciliation with the Lheidli T'enneh First Nation and Urban Indigenous members of the community









#### WHAT IS AN OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN?
