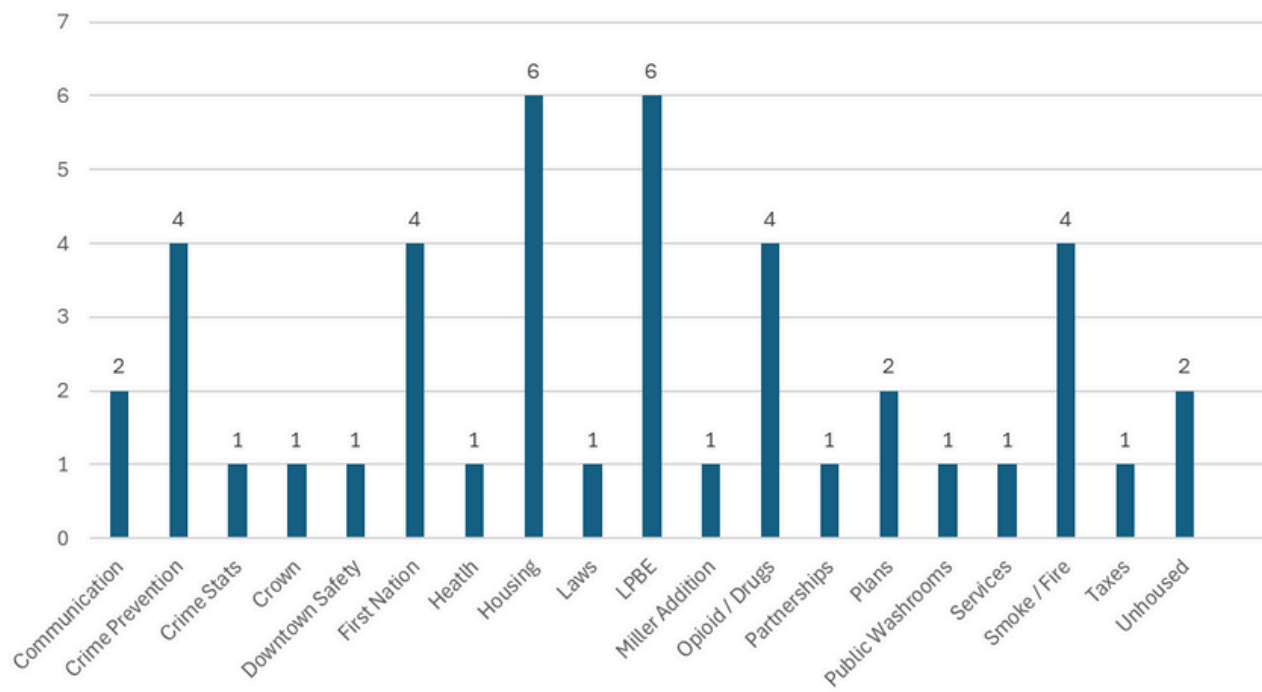

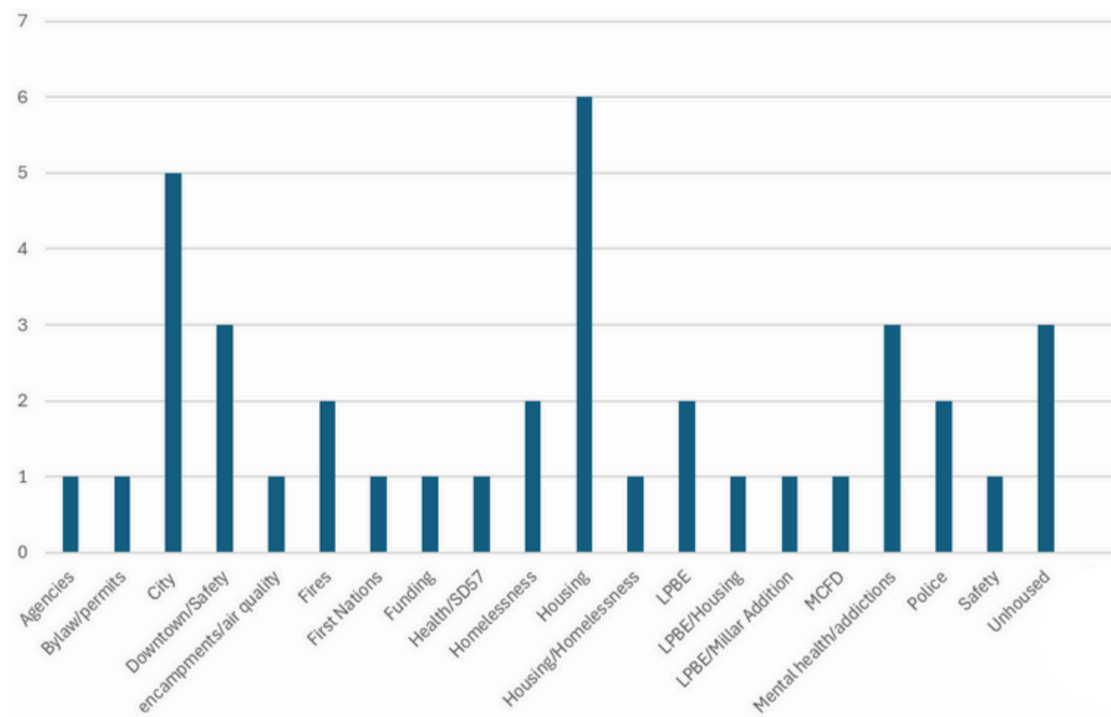

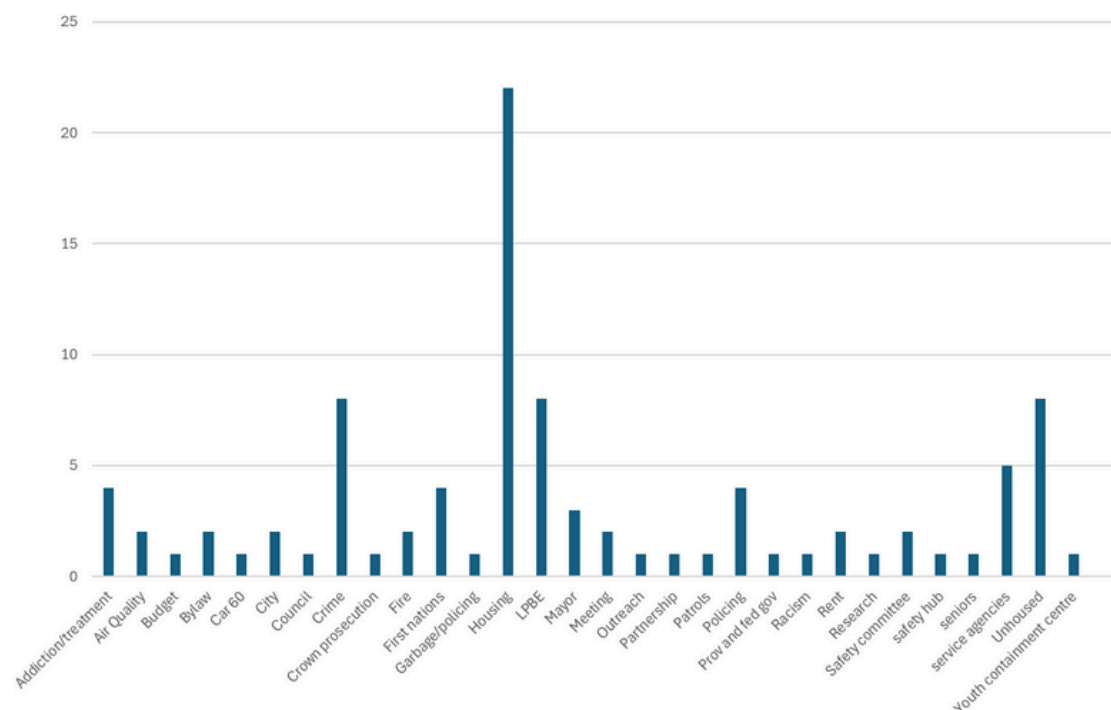

Community Safety Town Hall

The most common themes:

Questions and comments around housing, encampments, air quality and fires were the most common themes from the night. Here's a snapshot:

“During the presentation, the City's role as an advocate was highlighted. There are a variety of community organizations (Connective, St. Vincent, etc.) who provide services. How does the city support community organizations / non-profits which provide services to unhoused residents?”

“If everything goes as planned, how do you expect to clear the encampment after an injunction when the city has made the same site as an overnight camping area under the Parks and Open Spaces bylaw? Will the bylaw be amended at the same time to remove that designation?”

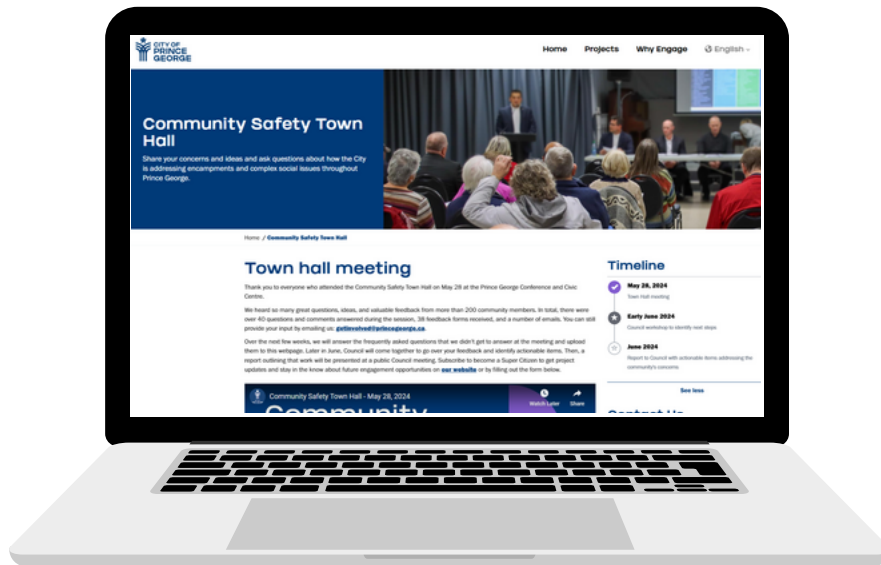
“We had a business in the downtown area for 16 years but chose to relocate our business at the end of our lease in 2022 due to safety issues in the downtown. What will the City and partners be doing immediately to address the safety issues in Prince George, but in particular the downtown?”

Has the City considered public washrooms in the downtown area? Ones that are sturdy, clean, heated and wheelchair accessible?
