Title: Balance

Description: This sculpture embodies the hope for a thriving ecosphere in balance. The human figure was cast in solid iron from a chainsaw carving in the trunk of an eighty foot tree. The tree element, from the tip of a second similarly sized tree, was charred before casting directly in bronze.

When exposed to great heat, pinecones open up. In nature, this ensures that the pine trees reseed themselves after fire, a natural occurrence in the lifecycle of the forest. Though both trees died as a result of a mountain pine beetle infestation, the open cones signal renewal and hope.

Events like the fall of our forests to the mountain pine beetle have precipitated greater awareness of our position as part of a single, dynamic, global organism. Von Tiesenhausen's tree, reconstituted here with a human form as its trunk, acknowledges how entwined we are. It reflects a prevailing shift in consciousness towards a more symbiotic relationship

Description: Eagle holding feather symbolizes freedom and represents the cleansing of the people and the land. On each of the eagle's wings are two watchmen guarding the land and watching for enemies or invaders. There is also an eye on the wing representing all our ancestors' spirits who witness the future.

Beaver is for the Canadian emblem, the symbol of all Canada united.

Four humans painted black, yellow, white and red represent all the people s from all four directions of the earth. The four colours also represent the four futures: love, honour, trust and respect. The red female figure represents equality and recognizes the importance of women in the family and community.

Salmon flowing through humans represent the rivers and waters, the source of one of the main foods that nurture our bodies.

Bear is one of the main house groups of the Carrier Nation. The bear's stomach is a hollowed cave out of which the four main house groups - wolf, frog, grouse and fireweed- emerge. This symbolizes Aboriginal peoples coming out of the hibernation and emergence from oppression.

The entire pole is an expression of unity and a celebration of the multicultural and aboriginal nature of Prince George

Description: This collaborative project includes a dugout canoe and glass tile mosaic. Mr. Frederick hewed the original canoe in the traditional First Nation's manner from a 100+ year old *landooz* (cottonwood tree), and then carved a representation of ancestral oral legend told to him by his Elders. This legend is one of many legends about a very vain character named 'Astas who learns many things through his actions. The story of 'Astas and the *talukw* (salmon) is part of a larger oral practice in which all stories relate and weave amongst each other to communicate the values, history and traditions of the Lheidli T'enneh.

To compliment this canoe, Lheidli T'enneh artist Jennifer Pighin created a colourful glass tile mosaic of eleven life-size native fish species of the Nechako and Fraser Rivers in the Prince George region.

Title: The Legacy Prayer Drum

Description: The Prayer Drum was created to incorporate the Lheidli T'enneh vision, the diversity of Canada, and the Canada Winter Games into a common vision.

The Prayer Drum vessel holds the stones that were gathered by elders who attended the BC First Nations Elders Gathering in 2013. Adding to these stones, the 2015 Canada Winter Games Host Society invited athletes/mission staff to bring rocks from their homes from all across Canada to be placed into the Prayer Drum. The drum is modeled after the traditional hand drum of the Lheidli T'enneh people. Having these rocks in the drum signifies a blessing to the people who brought the stones and the places that they represent. On the top of the drum, there is lattice with images of a white sturgeon, a cottonwood tree, the confluence of the Fraser and Nechako rivers, and the Canada Winter Games maple leaf.

The large up-right maple leaf is a representation of Canada and its diverse cultures and people. The four eagle feathers that alternate with the maple leaf are a representation of Canada's First Nations and their diverse cultures and people. It is also representative of the eagle on the Lheidli T'enneh First Nation logo. Furthermore, it represents a coming together of the four corners of Canada to the Canada Winter Games in Prince George, the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh. The centre pipe unites the Maple Leaf and the Eagle Feathers. It signifies the two as working together with the future in mind.

This ring around the drum has text expressing the vision of the Lheidli T'enneh people, in their traditional language. It is also written in English and French.

In English, the words translate to:
