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To the Prince George city clerk (and also the Mayor and the city council):

I wanted to express my deep opposition, disappointment and disgust at the attempt to rezone the above mentioned properties from RM9 (Manufactured Home Park) to RM6 (mid-rise residential).

The discussion seems to be focused on providing multi-family developments, which would typically be a good thing. However, doing so will technically leave all of the many current residents of the manufactured home park HOMELESS and they will be forced to spend considerable amounts of money to relocate if such a relocation is even possible. Not to mention all the relationships that have developed over the years among the residents.

Is this the intent of the developer (and owner) of the property (The Roman Catholic and Episcopal churches of Prince Rupert)? That would not speak well of the churches attitude towards those on low income, like my [Redacted] and [Redacted] [Redacted] and [Redacted], who happen to live at the site.

Is this the intent of the City of Prince George or the mayor or the city council to evict them from their home? That would not play well at the next election, and I am certain that this form of eviction will definitely become a very hot topic of much discussion.

Making so many current PG citizens homeless is not the answer. There are many other land parcels out there that can be developed and that would not displace anyone.

Neither is hiding for-profit development behind the guise of adding homes (many or most or all of which would be unaffordable for the current home park residents) by rezoning. It is shameless.

I demand that the city immediately deny any attempt to rezone the areas.
