



Making a Difference in 2024

Homework Help Tutoring Program

- Homework Help is a free tutoring program offering support for students grades 3-12 who need help with English, Math, or Sciences
- 20 sessions per week at both branches, accommodating up to 60 students; 120 participants registered since January 2024
- 96% of survey respondents had either not been able to access affordable tutoring previously, or had to discontinue use due to the cost or availability of tutoring services
- 85% of respondents reported improvement in their child's academic performance and/or confidence after attending Homework Help

My daughter needs additional support with English and Math, and tutoring is not affordable for us. This program was something she looks forward to as she requires more one on one and a quiet environment. Her reading improved and her confidence; I value this program and hope it continues.

Homework Help Tutoring Program



\$186,183 Increase in Wages & Related Expenses:


