- In 2007 the oval moved to its current and hopefully permanent location

















Volunteer hours – approx. 1200 –1800 person-hours/season





Main purpose: provide outdoor skating at a low cost
















- New PA system






- Skates for rental program

# Moving towards refrigeration – our request

- Assistance from the City
  - Development of comprehensive estimate of capital and operating costs of refrigeration.
  - Options to include refrigeration in concrete (opportunities for summer use), and in sand/crush (less expensive)
  - Listing of the oval refrigeration project in the capital plan
- Support from the Outdoor Ice Oval society
  - Funds raised for refrigeration
