# Recommendation(s):

That Council RECEIVES FOR INFORMATION the Committee of the Whole report from the Director of Civic Operations, and the Director of Civic Facilities and Events dated May 14, 2025 "Unfunded 2025 Capital Projects".

## **PURPOSE:**

During the 2025 Capital Planning Council meeting discussions, Council referred potential projects and unfunded future projects to Committee of the Whole meeting for further consideration.

Administration will be prepared to answer questions about these projects.

# BACKGROUND:

The following unfunded 2025 Capital projects were specifically identified by Council for discussion at a Committee of the Whole meeting as follows:

- That Council REFERS a potential capital project regarding a storage building to house the Little Prince train to a Committee of the Whole meeting for further consideration.
- That Council REFERS potential capital projects regarding the installation of two roundabouts at the University Way and Ceremonial Road intersection and the Tyner Boulevard and Ospika Boulevard intersection to a Committee of the Whole meeting for further consideration.
- That Council REFERS unfunded capital project #1384 "Rainbow Park Washroom" from the 2025 2029 Operational Financial Plan to a Committee of the Whole meeting for further consideration.
- That Council REFERS unfunded capital project #0853 "Lower Patricia Greenway Upgrade" from the 2025 – 2029 Operational Financial Plan to a Committee of the Whole meeting for further consideration.
- That Council REFERS a potential capital project regarding improvements to the sound system at the PG Conference and Civic Centre to a Committee of the Whole meeting for further consideration.

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### STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

The Capital Program (The infrastructure planning, budgeting and subsequent Capital Plan), considers Council approved direction set out in the <u>Organizational Capital Project Management Policy</u>, 2021, <u>Asset Management Policy</u> and <u>Sustainable Finance Policy</u> in addition to other inputs such as:

- Regulatory requirements, including health and safety
- Contractual and/or development obligations
- myPG framework (social, economic and environmental)
- Council goals and corporate workplan
- Master plans, strategic plans, asset management plans and assessments
- Probability of asset failure, consequence of that failure and the acceptability of that risk
- Operational needs to maintain level of service
- User need feedback (service requests, user group meetings, etc.)
- All other forms of public consultation
