RECOMMENDATIONS:

That Council CONSIDERS the Downtown Safe, Clean, and Inclusive Budget Enhancement Package.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to provide information to Council related to the Select Committee on A Safe, Clean, and Inclusive Community's discussion concerning the Downtown Safe, Clean, and Inclusive Budget Enhancement Package, and to obtain a decision from Council concerning the package.

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

The Select Committee and the Budget Enhancement Package support the Council Focus Area of "Enhance safety and security throughout Prince George with a focus on downtown."

BACKGROUND:

During the budget meeting of January 6, 2020, Council approved the following resolution: "That Council POSTPONES, to a future meeting of Council before the end of February 2020, consideration of Agenda items R.4: Environmental Services Service Enhancement – Climate Change and Energy Coordinator Position, and R.5: Service Enhancement – Downtown Safe, Clean and Inclusive Package". During the Open Council meeting of January 20, 2020, Council considered the Environmental Services Service Enhancement for a Climate Change and Energy Coordinator position.

During January 2020, Council struck the Select Committee on A Safe, Clean, and Inclusive Downtown, approved its Terms of Reference and membership, and held its first meeting (on January 22, 2020). During the February 3, 2020 meeting of Council, in response to a resolution from the Committee, Council approved that its name be changed to the Select Committee on A Safe, Clean, and Inclusive Community.

During the February 4, 2020 Select Committee meeting, Adam Davey, the Director of Community Services and Public Safety, provided information to the committee through a document titled: Service Enhancement – Downtown Safe, Clean and Inclusive Package (please see attachment 1) and through a

powerpoint presentation (slides are attachment 2). The Committee didn't approve a budget enhancement recommendation for City Council's consideration. However, members did provide numerous comments, which are summarized in the meeting minutes (please see attachment 3).

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

To date, City Council has approved the following tax levy increases: a general tax levy increase of 1.89% and an enhancement related tax levy increase of .26% (to fund a Data Processor Supervisor, a Forensic Video Analyst, and a Planner. The total 2020 tax levy increase approved by Council so far is 2.15%. Should Council approve the entire Downtown Safe, Clean, and Inclusive Package (which has a tax levy impact of 1.29%), the total 2020 tax levy increase would be 3.44%.

Below please find a table which categorizes the components of the enhancement package on the basis of criticality as determined by Senior City Administration. The table also differentiates those parts of the enhancement which would impact the City of Prince George 2020 general tax levy from those parts which would be funded by another source.
