Buchan House 2755 Hammond Avenue (constructed 1959)


Nielsen House 2280 McBride Crescent (constucted 1957)



- Replaced or repaired all 22 downtown interpretive signs.






- Heritage Expo, in partnership with UNBC and Prince George Public Library (March 2nd, 2019)






- Annual Local History Speaker Series, in partnership with the Prince George Public Library.

 - "Back to School" Presented by the PG Retired Teachers Association










