- Remember to resubmit your LFP and LFP Locum enrolment codes 98000/98005 between January 1 and March 31, 2026. See Section 26 'Enrolment and Annual re-enrolment' and Section 52 'Locum Enrolment and Annual Re-enrolment' in the LFP Payment Schedule.
- Remember to resubmit your Setting Registration Codes between January 1 and March 31, 2026.

- If you have billed the LFP Clinic-based Services Transition Code (98001) and are still transitioning after December 31, 2025, it is recommended to resubmit the Transition Code 98001 and the LFP Clinic-based Services Transition Form between January 1 and March 31, 2026. For more information, see Section 37 (c) in the LFP Payment Schedule.
