Between 1942 & 2018:



Annual days below -25°C decreased from 18 to 7 days/year



Average Winter Temperatures **12.8** C



Winter Precipitation 40.5%





Summer Precipitation J 28.5%

Annual **Temperature to** Increase by an Additional 2°C


